### A Message from our Shepherd

#### Shine!

Will the new law stand or will it be repealed? Should an entirely new law be put into place? Can you think of how many new laws have been put into place in your lifetime? Can you remember some of the really good ones – or maybe some of the really lousy ones? Sometimes it seems that the only law that will always be true – is that the laws will always change!

How amazing to consider that throughout our entire lifetime, throughout our parents' lifetime, throughout all time – not one of God's laws has changed. God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness. God called the light "day," and the darkness he called "night." And there was evening, and there was morning – the first day (Genesis 1:3-5).

"And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them serve as signs to mark seasons and days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the sky to give light on the earth." And it was so. God made two great lights – the greater light to govern the day and the lesser light to govern the night. He also made the stars. (Genesis 1:14-16).

Every day since God first told it to shine, the sun has been radiant. Every day since God told the moon to reflect the light of the sun it has filled young eyes and old eyes with wonder. Every day since God made them the sun and the moon and the stars have faithfully proclaimed the work of God's hands.

You, dear Christian, are also the work of God's hands. He formed you. He gave you your life. And he has placed you in a particular place for a particular purpose – to proclaim the glory of God. St. Paul reminds us, For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do (Ephesians 2:20).

Have you seized every opportunity to do good – knowing that perhaps that opportunity was one that God prepared in advance so that you might shine the love of Jesus to another? Have you missed some opportunities close to home? Have you missed opportunities *in* your home?

This week I will look up at the sky at night and be amazed all over again at the power and the order and the love of our God. And then I will ask God to help me look around where he has placed me. His light and his love are so magnificent! Please join with me and ask God to help me and to help you brighten someone else's day by reflecting his love. And then shine!




